This event is geared towards foreign nationals living in Niigata City so if that's you, be sure to sign up (and don't forget your apron, bandana, and hand towel)!



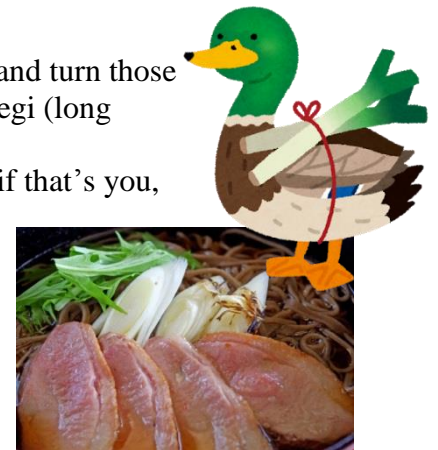

PSA: How to Properly Dispose of Plastic Trash



When disposing of plastics (marked with the プラ mark shown to the left), be sure to follow a few key rules to make it easier for the people who sort the trash to do their job and makes sure the plastic can actually be recycled instead of thrown into the burnable trash.

- DO NOT put a bag of plastic trash inside of another bag! (example to the right)
- Make sure the trash is clean (no sauce, dirt, etc.)
- Make sure that it has the above mark on it!
- If you are not sure if you can recycle something as plastic trash, refer to the “Household Trash Sorting and Disposal Guide” that you receive upon moving to the city or the corresponding smartphone application.

Empty the trash out of the smaller bag when you need to use a bigger bag. For reals.
