

Meet the Niigata International Exchange Foundation's (NIEF) newest staff member, Mr. Tōyama Satoru! He wrote a few words to greet everyone:

I worked at the Niigata City International Affairs Division for a year and a half as a temporary employee until March of this year. Then in April 2024, I became an employee at NIEF.

I am originally from Aichi Prefecture and it has been 5 years since I moved to my wife's hometown of Niigata. At first, I was bewildered by the quickly changing weather and large amounts of snow found on the Sea of Japan side of Japan. Jing Jiang Rou Si (Pork with Peking Sauce)

Jing jiang rou si is a traditional dish from Beijing made from pork loin strips simmered in sauce. It's said to have originated from the infamous dish, Peking Duck. This dish is commonly eaten with tofu wraps but you can also enjoy it with spring rolls.

This recipe was featured in a Chinese cooking class taught by Ms. Chen Xiaoyan, a Niigata resident and Hangzhou native, last year and uses chicken instead of pork. If you prefer the traditional pork to chicken, you can easily swap it out.

Ingredients (Serves 4 people)				
Chicken thighs (or pork)	500 g	Salt	A pinch	
Egg white	1	Cooking sake	1 Tbsp	
Tofu skin (干豆腐)	3	Dark soy sauce	1 Tbsp	
Carrot	1	Tianmian sauce (Sweet bean sauce)	2 Tbsp	
Cucumber	2	Oyster sauce	1 Tbsp	
Long green onion	1	Light soy sauce	1 Tbsp	
Garlic 3	cloves	Sugar	1 tsp	
Water	1 Tbsp	Potato starch dissolved in water		
	_	(50 cc water + 1 Tbsp potato starch)		
Oil	2 Tbsp	White sesame seeds (sprinkle	d on top)	



1. Make the tofu wraps

Cut the carrot, cucumber, and long green onion into long strips and wrap tightly in the tofu skin (be careful not to tear the skin). Cut diagonally into 8 pieces. Arrange the wraps around the edge of plate leaving the center empty, as shown in the photo above.

- 2. Mince the garlic. Prepare the potato starch water.
- 3. Slice the chicken (or pork) into fine strips and season with salt, cooking sake, and dark soy sauce. After the meat is fully coated in the seasoning, add egg white and mix well. Then, add 1 tsp of oil (separate from ingredient list) and mix well.
- 4. Prepare the sauce.

 Place the tianmian sauce, oyster sauce, sugar, light soy sauce, and water into a bowl. Mix well.
- 5. Heat oil in a fry pan, add the minced garlic and fry until fragrant. Add the seasoned meat from step 3 and fry.
 - After the meat is fully cooked, add the sauce from step 4, boil, add the potato starch water, and thicken the sauce.
- 6. Place the meat from step 5 in the center of the plate with the tofu wraps and top with white sesame. Enjoy~\$\infty\$


